## Sunday School News

This year Sunday School classes will be held throughout the summer, as will the Sunday morning Adult Class. This development is in response to a request from several members of the congregation. One combined-age class will be offered for the children of the congregation.

As at other times of the year, we will use materials from Concordia Publishing House's *Growing in Christ* series. The 2011 summer curriculum is entitled "Journey with Jesus." During June, July, and August, our children will "visit" such Biblical locations as Eden, Bethany, and Malta, and travel with companions like Elisha, Jehoshaphet, and Onesimus. The *Growing in Christ* summer curriculum is designed in such a way that all pupil materials can be photocopied from the Teacher Guide, with no need to purchase additional student lesson packets.

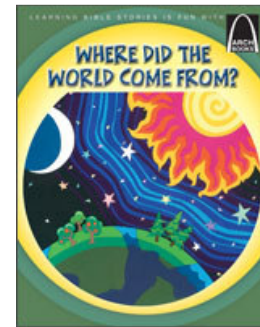
This approach offers more economical and flexible options for congregations to plan their summer education programs.

During class the pupils will also make use of some new creation-themed materials which have recently become

available. One of our church families donated to the Sunday School a "Days of Creation" nesting ball. Designed similar to a "Matryoshka" doll, this ball consists of six colorful layers, each of which portrays the things God created on that respective day of the creation week.



The children will also be reading a new CPH "Arch Book" entitled *Where Did the World Come From?*



Karyn Lussky Lukasek, who graduated from our synod's Bethany Lutheran College in 2009 with a degree in studio art, prepared the artwork and poetic text. (Members of Redeemer may remember Karyn's grandfather, Rev. Norman Madson, who served as a vacancy pastor here during 2004–2005). ## *From the Pastor's Desk*

During the summer months things usually slow down here in Arizona. Because of the heat we are usually less busy. We stay inside and are less active. But in the church year, there is no corresponding break from important activity! And so in our worship life as a congregation, several important things will be happening – just in the month of June.

On June 2 the Ascension of our Lord will be observed in a Divine Service at 7 p.m. This is the last of the four great festivals of Christ that we mark each year – the others being Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter. Ascension Day does not celebrate the Lord's absence from us, but it celebrates a new kind of presence – an exalted presence of our divine-human Savior everywhere, with the saints in heaven and with all his people on earth.

“This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore *exalted at the right hand of God*, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing” (Acts 2:32-33, ESV).

On June 12 we will mark the Day of Pentecost – the festival of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of Christ dwells among us and within us. He brings Christ to us, even as he is sent to us by Christ from the right hand of the Father. He is the Lord, and the giver of life. He is always at work through the Gospel, regenerating fallen humanity and renewing us in faith.

“This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father *the promise of the Holy Spirit*, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing” (Acts 2:32-33, ESV).

The first Sunday after Pentecost is the festival of the Holy Trinity. Every Sunday is, of course, an acknowledgment of the Trinity, because the only God we ever worship, on any day of the year, is the God who makes himself known to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. On Trinity Sunday, however, we focus in

on this mystery in such a way as to be reminded that we do not worship a God of our own imagination, or a generic deity who can assume whatever form people prefer. We worship instead a God who has revealed his existence, and his saving work, in some very specific and concrete ways.

“This *Jesus* God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from *the Father* the promise of *the Holy Spirit*, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing” (Acts 2:32-33, ESV).

So, while things may be slowing down in our Arizona culture, things are not slowing down in our ecclesiastical and liturgical culture. There is much to learn, and much to be involved with, as Redeemer Lutheran Church presses forward – or rather, as we are drawn forward by the loving Lord of the church – into important celebrations of our faith and salvation.

### *Sunday Morning Schedule*

The Elders have approved a slight modification to the Sunday morning worship schedule. Until now, the full public Divine Service of Word and Sacrament has been held on the first, third, and fifth Sundays of the month, and a public Service of the Word followed by a spoken service of Communion has been held on the second and fourth Sundays of the month.

An exception to this has been that the Service of the Word with spoken Communion has also been held whenever there has been a guest pastor (even if there would otherwise have been a full Divine Service on that day).

The new modification is that the full public Divine Service of Word and Sacrament will now be held whenever a festival falls on a Sunday (even if there would otherwise have been a Service of the Word with spoken Communion on that day). In the coming months this will mean that the full public Divine Service will be celebrated on Pentecost and Christmas Day, which will fall this year on what otherwise would have been spoken Communion Sundays.

So let us keep the festival
