A Note on Offering Envelopes

The cost last year for boxed offering envelopes, and for the envelopes that are placed in the pews for visitors to use if they wish, was around \$200. Instead of getting a new supply of envelopes for this year, the church is going to distribute boxes of envelopes from previous years that were never used. You may also use whatever envelopes you may have left from last year's box, or from earlier years. It doesn't matter that the dates printed on these old envelopes do not match the dates when you give your offering. Just write your name on the envelope, and your offering will be credited to you in the giving statement you receive at the end of the year for tax deduction purposes, for the date on which you give it. If you make your contribution in the form of a check, your name as printed on the check is enough identification for you to receive credit for that offering.

Ushering Schedule

The church is going to be organizing its usher schedule in a more formal way. Donald Schmeissing will continue as head usher of the congregation, and will, as before, serve in that role on the Sundays when he is present. But we are also encouraging other men to sign up on the new sign-up sheet that will now be available, to serve as second usher for the various services that are scheduled. Ushers' duties include folding and stuffing bulletins before the service; passing out bulletins to worshipers as they enter the church (and special guest bulletins to all first-time visitors), while greeting worshipers (especially first-time visitors) as they arrive; helping people get to a seat, and go to and from Communion, if that help is needed; receiving the offering, and putting the center crossbar of the chancel railing in place for Communion services; answering questions from visitors, or directing visitors to the pastor or elders if their questions should be addressed to them; directing people who ask to restrooms and to the childcare room; lighting and extinguishing candles; counting and recording the numbers of people attending worship, Communion, Bible Class, and Sunday School; and so forth. We want to encourage any and all capable men to take a turn from time to time in helping in this way. Both members *and friends* of the congregation are invited to sign up. . . . But probably not.

I remember the story of a woman who, some time ago, believed what she received in the mail. It was telling her that she was already a WINNER!

She instantly saw dollar signs -- millions coming her way! She bought all kinds of expensive things, believing she just struck it rich. Later she found out: they tell everybody they're Already a Winner. She found herself deep in debt and facing an uncertain future.

The world's wisdom says: "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." "There's no such thing as getting something for nothing."

Yet, when it comes to spiritual things, the world's wisdom is: You're already sitting on a gold mine! You have spiritual wisdom and potential within! They tell us this, even though our world is plunged into death, darkness, confusion, and sin.
